Interfraternity Council


The Interfraternity Council (IFC) is the governing body for 16 fraternities at Missouri S&T. Comprised of representatives from each chapter, the IFC supports fraternity success, oversees recruitment, and organizes major Greek events like Greek Week in the fall and Greek Sing in the spring.

Panhellenic Council

The Panhellenic Council (Panhel) governs the three sororities at Missouri S&T. Panhel organizes events to bring the sorority community together, including the primary recruitment process each fall and all-sorority socials. Additionally, they help the other Greek councils with Greek Week in the fall semester and Brighter Lights, Brighter Future in the spring semester.

Greek Independent Council

The Greek Independent Council (GIC) is the governing body for six greek chapters on campus — two sororities and one fraternity, as well as 3 NPHC chapters. Throughout the year, GIC hosts fundraising and philanthropy events, giving members the chance to make a real impact on local organizations.


Academics

Our Greek community puts a strong emphasis on academic success. Historically, the all-Greek GPA has matched or exceeded the campus average. Most chapters require weekly study hours, especially for new members, to ensure academics stay a priority. Greek students regularly form study groups, making it easy to find classmates and share advice. Older members are always willing to offer tips on courses, professors and degree programs. The “school comes first” mindset is a big reason why S&T’s Greek alumni go on to succeed after graduation.



Community


Housing

Greek housing offers a unique and affordable alternative to dorm living. Missouri S&T’s Greek community features 19 chapter houses. All Greek houses are designated as “University-Approved Housing,” meaning they fulfill the two-year on-campus living requirement and serve as an alternative to dorms. Students living in Greek houses enjoy their own meal programs, run by private chefs. Most Greek housing is also less expensive than university residence halls and offers amenities you won’t find in campus housing. Chapter houses are a point of pride for our community, with several ranking among the largest Greek houses in the nation.



Intramurals

Many Greek chapters at Missouri S&T form teams to compete in intramural sports (IMs), offering a fun and healthy way to stay active and engage in friendly competition. Chapters often create house teams. It’s not just about the games — it’s about making lasting memories, forging new connections, and learning the value of fair play and teamwork. IMs include popular team sports like soccer, ultimate frisbee and basketball, as well as Esports, pickleball, badminton and weightlifting.





Professional Development

Greek Life at Missouri S&T places a strong focus on professional development to help you prepare for life after graduation. Landing your first internship or co-op can be tough without real-world experience, but joining a chapter gives you early leadership opportunities to build your resume and stand out to recruiters. Chapters host workshops to prepare their students for career fairs – whether it's perfecting your elevator speech, polishing your resume, or mastering job interviews. Plus, many chapters connect members with Greek alumni who often recruit for internships and coops at their companies, giving you a valuable network to tap into.



Philanthropy

All Greek chapters support philanthropic organizations, with many supporting both local and national causes. Our Greek community raises thousands of dollars annually and contributes hundreds of volunteer hours. Greek chapters organize and participate in a variety of fundraising events, service projects and awareness campaigns – from charity runs and benefit dinners to hands-on community volunteering. HOW TO JOIN GREEK LIFE

For Greek chapters under the Interfraternity Council or the Greek Independent Council, recruitment is informal – each chapter recruits on its own schedule without a set process. The best way to start is to talk with members at events like A&R days, Miner Welcome Bash, or reach out on social media.


The Panhellenic Council holds a process called "Primary Recruitment," which is more structured. This three-day event, held at the end of Opening Week, gives you the chance to meet all three Panhellenic sororities. To get involved, sign up for Primary Recruitment on the S&T Panhellenic Council's website (sites.mst.edu/panhellenic).

Most fraternities, sororities and councils have tables at S&T events such as A&R days, Miner Welcome Bash and open houses. This is the perfect opportunity to learn more about Greek Life at S&T, hear from our students themselves, and discover how you can get involved.

COMMON WORDS AND PHRASES

Active Member: A fully initiated member of a fraternity or sorority

Advising and Registration

Day (A&R Day): A campus-hosted event for new students to register for classes with advisors, where Greek Life organizations also recruit.

Alumni: Former active members of a Greek chapter who have graduated from Missouri S&T and are no longer students.

Bid Card: A formal, official invitation to join a fraternity or sorority.

Big Brother/Sister: An active member who mentors a new member in their Greek chapter.

Brighter Lights, Brighter

Futures (BLBF): A week of spring philanthropy events organized by the Interfraternity Council and Panhellenic Council, with all-Greek participation, benefiting CASA of South-Central Missouri.

Chapter Dues: Periodical payments to the chapter to pay for room and board, activities, amenities, etc.; amounts vary by chapter.

Greek Chapter: The full membership of a fraternity or sorority, an organization designated by Greek letters that provides a community for its members.

Greek Council: A governing body made up of members from the Greek chapters it oversees.

Greek Sing: A “battle of the bands” event organized by the Interfraternity Council, where all Greek chapters compete by performing two songs each.

Greek Week: A week-long all-Greek event each fall where chapters compete in sports, online gaming, strength tests and artistic events.

Initiation: The ceremony in which a new member becomes an active member of their chapter.

Legacy: A student related to an alumnus/alumna or active of a particular Greek chapter on Missouri S&T's campus.

New Member: A student who has joined a fraternity or sorority but has not yet been initiated.

New Member Process: The period after accepting a bid and before initiation, during which new members learn about their chapter's history and values.

Philanthropy: Charitable and service activities or events organized by Greek chapters to support designated national or local causes.

Potential New Member (PNM): Any Missouri S&T student interested in joining Greek Life

Recruitment/Rush: The process by which Greek chapters invite new members to join.

Recruitment Event: Any event where a fraternity or sorority is actively recruiting potential new members (PNMs).
